TOP THINGS TO DO

- **The Tyne Bridges Walk** — Stroll the Quayside and count the seven bridges spanning the gorge, crossing the elegant Gateshead Millennium Bridge...
- **Newcastle Castle & Grey Street** — Climb the 12th-century Norman keep that gave the city its name for panoramic views, then walk up to Grey Street — one...
- **BALTIC Centre for Contemporary Art** — A converted flour mill on the Gateshead riverbank housing cutting-edge contemporary art across five floors.
- **Tynemouth Priory & Castle** — Perched dramatically on a headland above the North Sea, this English Heritage site spans a 7th-century priory, a...
- **Tynemouth Longsands & Fish Quay** — A mile of golden North Sea beach just south of the priory, popular with surfers — then head to North Shields Fish Quay...

BEST WALKS

- **Quayside & Bridges Loop** 2.5 km · ~45 min · Easy · Free — Walk the Newcastle Quayside east toward the Millennium Bridge, cross into Gateshead, visit BALTIC and The Glasshouse (formerly Sage...
- **Tynemouth Coastal Walk** 2 km · ~40 min · Easy · Free — From Tynemouth Metro station, walk down to Front Street, descend to King Edward's Bay (a sheltered sandy cove beneath the priory...

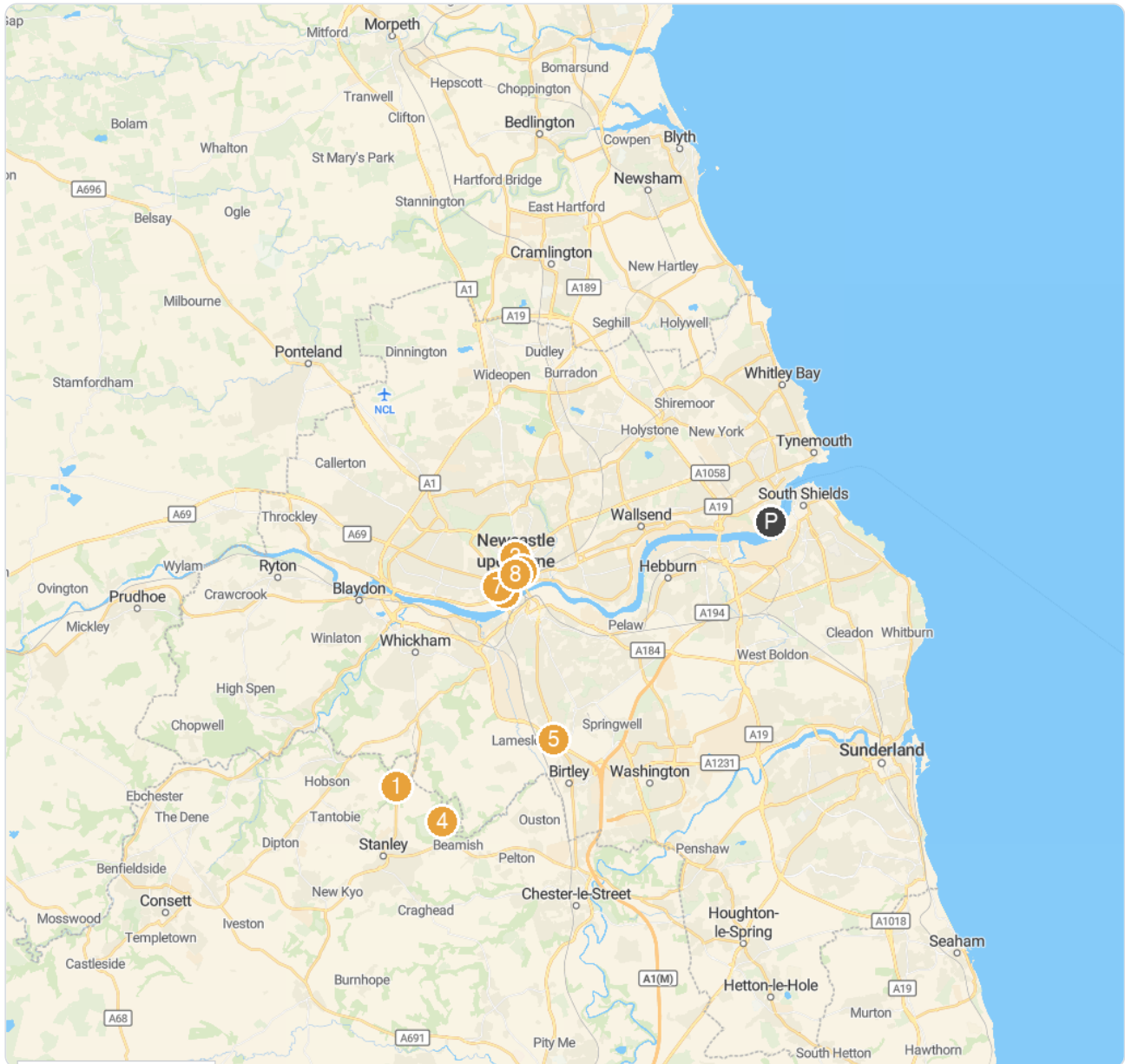
