 - Sled Dog Kennel Visit** — Meet Iditarod-veteran Alaskan Huskies at a local kennel, hear mushers' stories, and take a

 - Flightseeing over the Seward Peninsula** — Soar over vast tundra, rivers, historic gold dredges, and catch glimpses of the Bering Strait from a small plane or...
 - Downtown Walking & Gold Rush History** — Self-guided or guided walk of Front Street: the Iditarod Arch, Carrie M.

BEST WALKS

- Front Street Historic Walk** 1.5 km · Flat · 30–45 min — Start at the Nome Visitor Center and stroll Front Street east to west: the Iditarod Finish Line Arch, Anvil City Square with the Three...
- Bering Sea Beach Stroll** 1 km · Flat · 20 min — Walk the dark-sand beach along Front Street.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Layer up: Even in July, Nome can be in the low 50s°F with sharp winds off the Bering Sea. Bring a windproof jacket, hat, and gloves — you'll use them.
- Bug spray is essential if you go beyond downtown. Tundra mosquitoes are ferocious and relentless the moment you leave the waterfront.
