GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Most ships berth at Moll de Ponent, a short walk to the centre; some smaller vessels anchor and tender

Best For: Seafood lovers, beach days, medieval village day trips

Walk to centre: 5-10 min from pier to Old Town and Platja Gran beach

Don't Miss: Fresh Palamós prawns at a harbourfront restaurant and the Museu de la Pesca

 Getting around:  Taxi  Meter (short trip ~€5–€10)

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Palamós Prawn Tasting** — Palamós prawns (*Aristeus antennatus*) carry the official 'Gamba de Palamós' guarantee mark and are best eaten simply...
- **Museu de la Pesca** — One of the Mediterranean's best fishing museums sits right at the port.
- **Girona Old City** — Forty-five minutes inland, Girona's cathedral, Arab Baths, and labyrinthine Jewish Quarter (El Call) make for an...
- **Dalí Theatre-Museum, Figueres** — Salvador Dalí designed his own museum — the world's largest surrealist object.
- **Camí de Ronda Coastal Walk** — The ancient coastal path links secluded coves and rocky headlands north and south of town.

BEST WALKS

- **Port to Old Town & Platja Gran** 1.5 km loop • 30-45 min • Easy — From the cruise quay walk along the harbour promenade past fishing boats to the Old Town, wind through the Santa Maria del Mar church...
- **Camí de Ronda to Cala de la Fosca** 4 km one-way • 1.5-2 hrs • Easy-moderate — Head north from the port along the Camí de Ronda coastal path to reach the sheltered sandy bay of Cala de la Fosca — perfect for a swim.

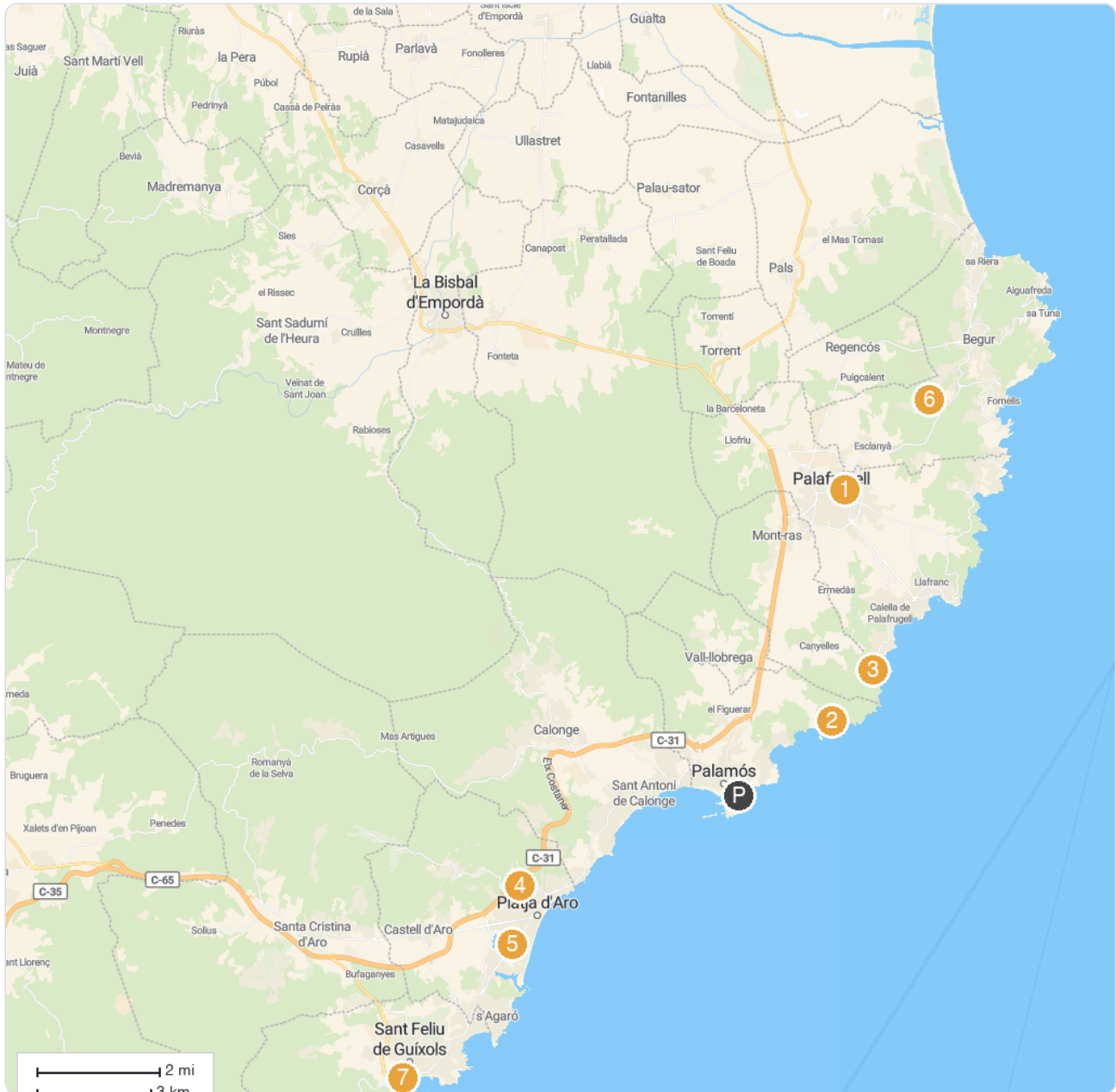
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Order the prawns: Palamós gambas are among Spain's finest and carry an official quality-guarantee mark — a half-dozen costs €15-25 depending on the restaurant. Worth every cent.
- Siesta: Many Old Town shops close 13:30–17:00. Hit the Museu de la Pesca and market in the morning; save the beach for the
