Walk to center: 15–20 min walk to Pembroke Dock town; Pembroke Castle ~2 miles (taxi recommended)

Don't Miss: Pembroke Castle (birthplace of Henry VII) and Freshwater West beach (Dobby's Grave)

- **Tenby & Castle Beach** — Tenby is a pastel-painted Georgian seaside town with medieval walls, a working fishing harbor, and some of the best...
- **Freshwater West — Harry Potter Beach** — A wild, windswept Atlantic beach famous for surfing and its film connections — Dobby's Grave from Harry Potter and the...
- **St Davids Cathedral & Bishop's Palace** — Visit the UK's smallest city — a 12th-century cathedral of extraordinary spiritual and architectural beauty, set in a...

- **Pembroke Dock Waterfront & Defensible Barracks** ⌚ 1 hr · 🚶 Easy, flat · 📏 ~1.5 miles — Walk from the pier along the waterfront to the landmark Front Street Gun Tower — one of two 1851 Martello-style gun towers defending...

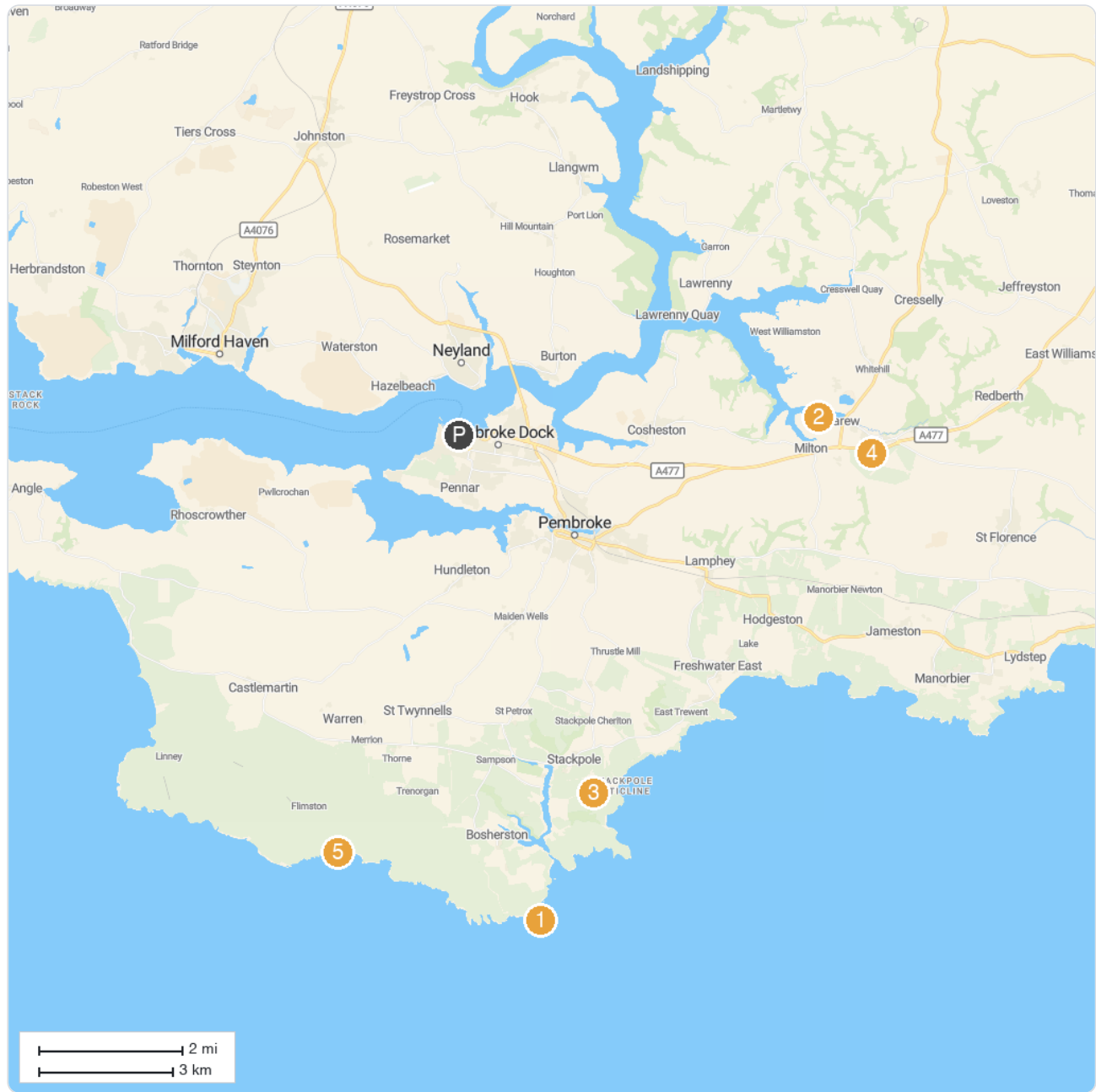
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Book taxis in advance. Pembrokeshire is rural and taxis are limited. If you want to reach Tenby, St Davids, or outlying beaches, arrange transport before arriving or through your...
- Trains to Tenby are sparse — only about 9 a day (roughly every 3–4 hours) — check the schedule before leaving the ship. Missing a train means a long wait or an expensive taxi back.
- Bring a waterproof jacket. Welsh weather is famously changeable. Even sunny mornings can turn wet fast — layering is essential
