TOP THINGS TO DO

- Mayflower II & Plymouth Rock** — A full-scale reproduction of the original Pilgrim ship is docked steps from your pier.
- Plimoth Patuxet Living History Museum** — Three miles south of the harbor, this world-class museum brings 1620s Plymouth to life with a recreated English Village...
- Pilgrim Hall Museum** — Opened in 1824, the oldest continuously operating public museum in the US houses actual Pilgrim artifacts — William...
- Plymouth Long Beach Walk** — A 3-mile barrier beach about 2.5 miles from the pier, Plymouth Long Beach is perfect for a breezy Atlantic stroll and...
- Waterfront Seafood Crawl** — The harbor waterfront is lined with seafood restaurants.

BEST WALKS

- Pilgrim History Loop** 1.5 miles · 45-60 min · Flat · Free — From the pier, walk south to Plymouth Rock and Mayflower II, then cross Water Street up Cole's Hill for harbor views and the Massasoit...
- National Monument to the Forefathers** 1 mile each way · 30-40 min · Gentle uphill · Free — Walk inland from the waterfront to see the massive 81-foot solid-granite monument honoring the Pilgrims' virtues — one of the largest...

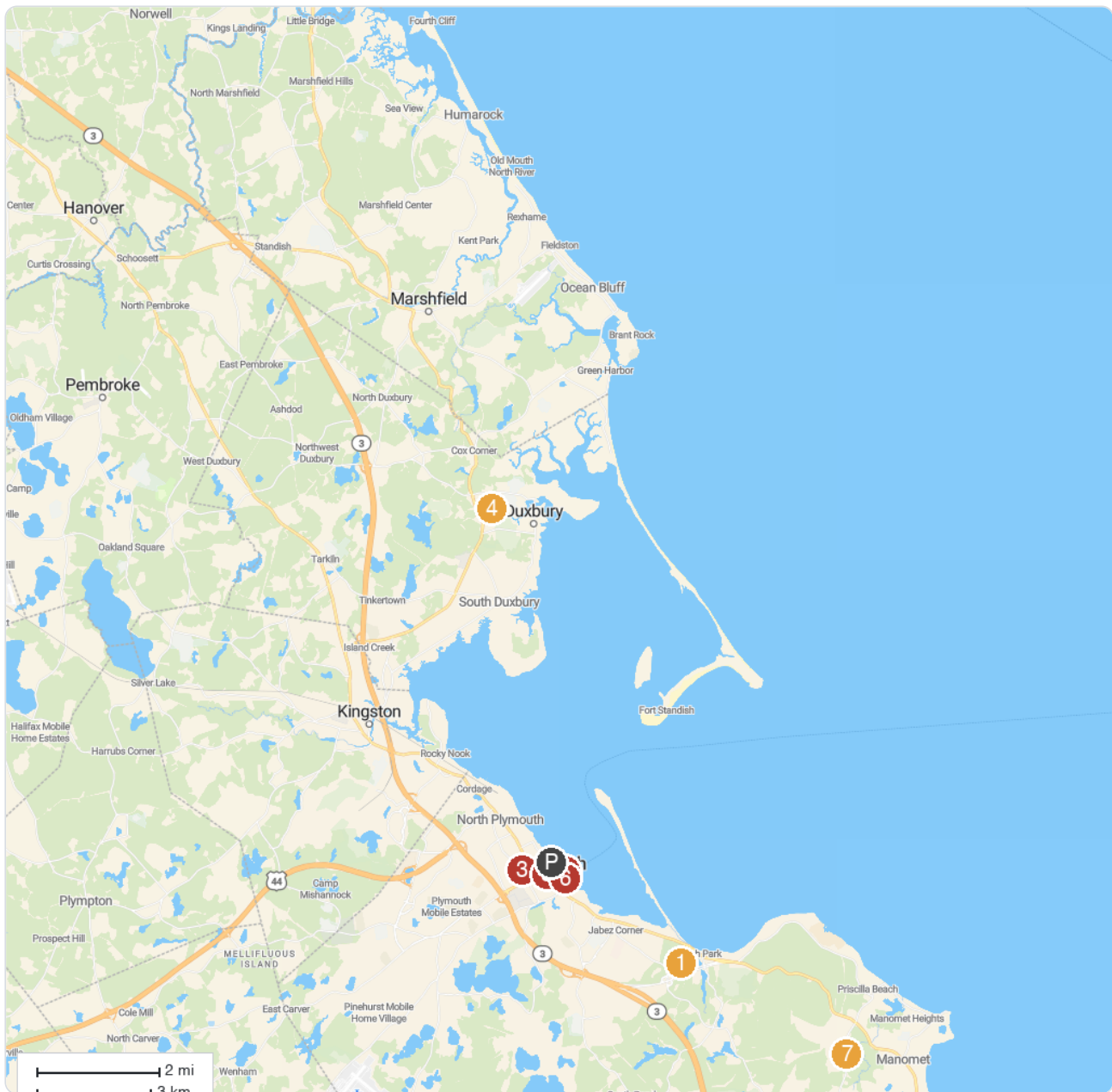
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
