

# Port Said, Port Said Governorate, Egypt

Port Said sits at the Mediterranean entrance to the Suez Canal, where container ships pass close enough to feel like part of the skyline. Stay local for canal views, a free ferry to Port Fouad, and seafood, or commit to a long escorted day to Cairo.

## GETTING ASHORE

**Docking:** Ships usually dock alongside at Port Said's tourist quay; tendering is not typical

**Best For:** Suez Canal watching, Cairo day trips, local seafood, colonial-era streets

**Walk to center:** 5-15 minutes to the Corniche, waterfront streets, and Port Fouad ferry

**Don't Miss:** The free public ferry to Port Fouad across the Suez Canal

- **Cairo, Giza Pyramids & Sphinx** — The headline excursion from Port Said: an early bus or private van run to the Giza plateau, often paired with Cairo...
- **Port Fouad by Free Ferry** — Cross the Suez Canal on the public ferry to Port Fouad, a quieter sister city with broad streets, canal views, and a...
- **Port Said Military Museum** — A compact museum covering Port Said's role in modern Egyptian history, especially the Suez Crisis and later conflicts...
- **Seafood Lunch in Port Said** — Port Said is a strong local seafood town.
- **Corniche, Canalfront & Beach** — Keep the day simple with a stroll along Palestine Street and the Corniche, ship-watching at the canal entrance, and a...

## BEST WALKS

- **Suez Canal Waterfront Stroll** 1-2 km | Easy | Flat waterfront streets — Walk from the cruise terminal area toward Palestine Street for close-up views of canal traffic and the city waterfront.
- **Free Ferry to Port Fouad** 1-2 hrs | Easy | Ferry plus short town walk — Use the public ferry across the Suez Canal, then walk a small loop in Port Fouad before returning the same way.
- **Port Said Military Museum** 2-3 km | Easy | City streets — A practical in-town target if you want a real stop rather than only a promenade walk.

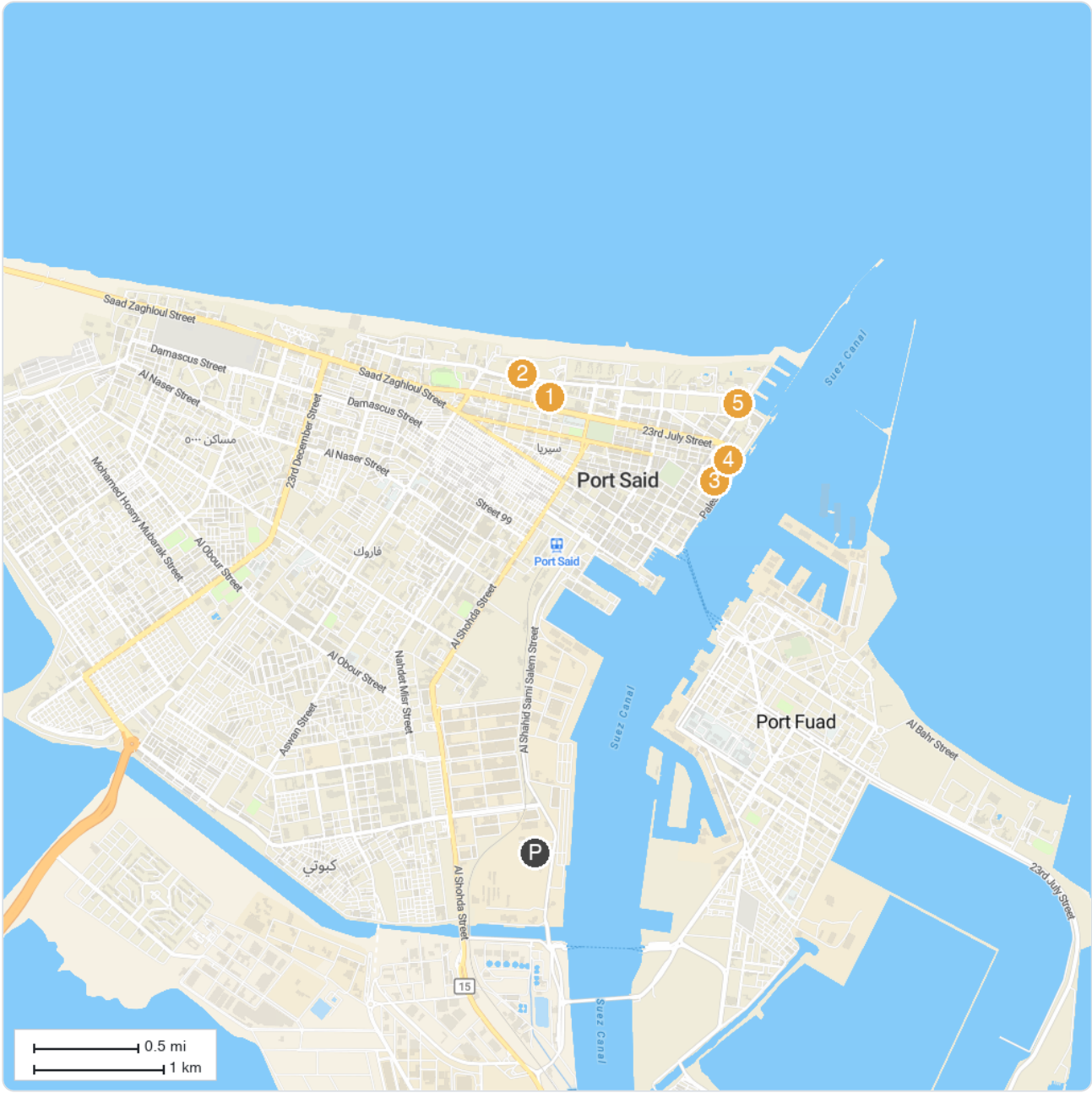
