TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Sankyo Soko Rice Storehouses** — Twelve black-walled wooden storehouses built in 1893 line a shaded zelkova-tree boulevard that has become Sakata's most...
- **Somaro Maiko Teahouse** — One of the only active maiko (apprentice geisha) cultures outside Kyoto.
- **Former Honma Family Residence & Museum** — Explore the estate of Japan's wealthiest merchant dynasty — so rich the locals said they'd rather be a Honma than a...
- **Kaikoji Temple — Self-Mummified Monks** — Sakata's most unusual sight: two Sokushinbutsu — Buddhist monks who self-mummified through years of extreme diet and...
- **Dewa Sanzan — Sacred Mountain Shrines** — About an hour by car, Mount Haguro is the most accessible of the three sacred Dewa mountains, featuring a 2,446-step...

BEST WALKS

- **Historic Merchant District Loop** 2 km · ~2 hrs · Easy, flat — From the Sankyo Soko storehouses, walk through the historic downtown to the Somaro Maiko Teahouse, past Hiyoriyama Park (great sea...
- **Honma Estate & Imoriyama Park** 1.5 km · ~1.5 hrs · Easy — Walk from central Sakata to the Former Honma Family Residence, then continue to the Honma Museum of Art set within the beautiful...

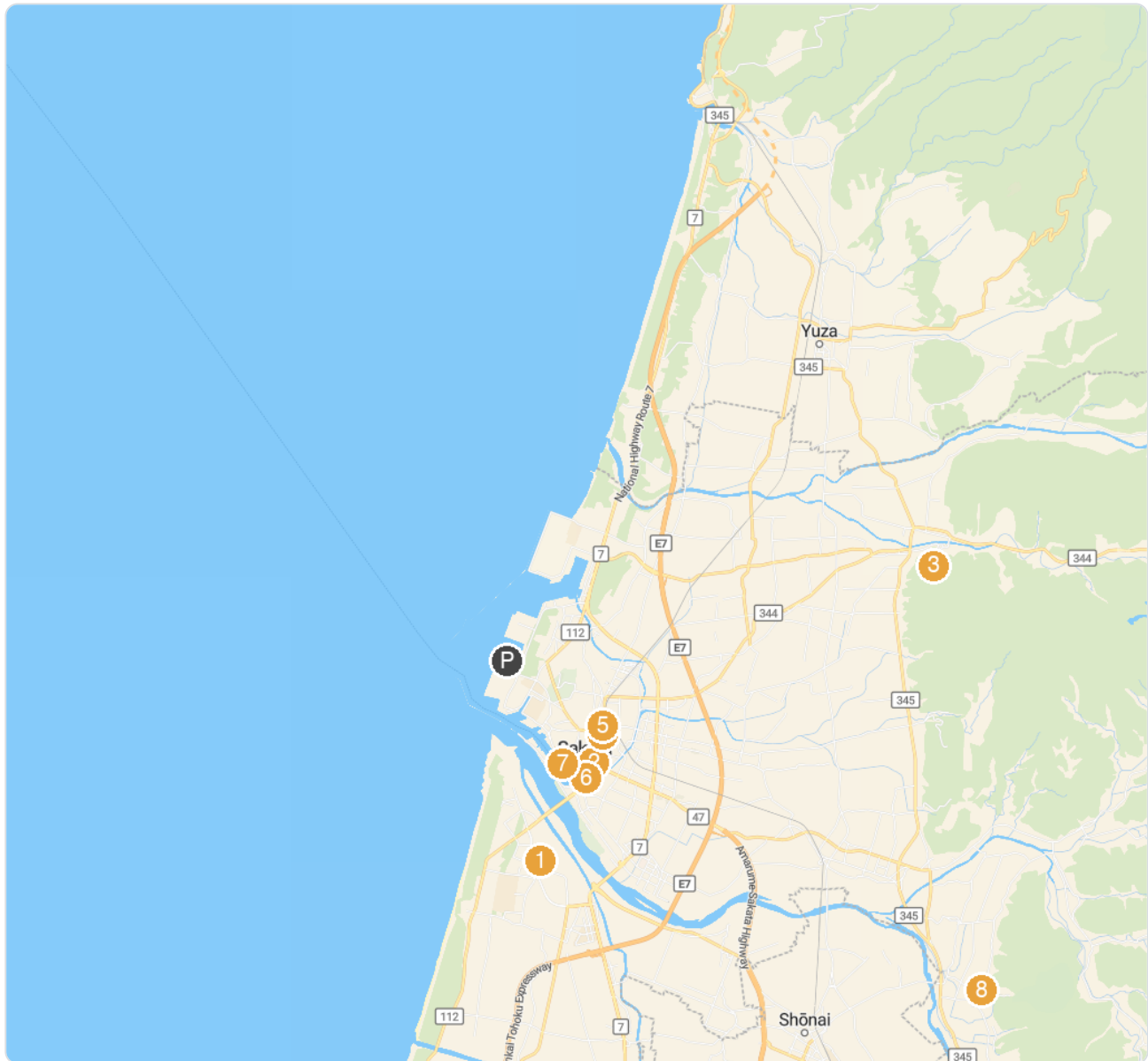
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
