

St Agnes, Isles of Scilly, England

Barely a mile across and home to just 80 residents, St Agnes is one of England's most remote inhabited islands — no cars, no noise, just clifftop paths, turquoise coves, and a legendary pub steps from the quay.

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Tender to Porth Conger Quay; larger ships may tender to St Mary's first, then inter-island boat

Best For: Wild beaches, coastal walking, puffins (May–Jul), off-the-beaten-path charm

Walk to center: The Turk's Head pub is 1 min from the quay; island loop ~2 hrs

Don't Miss: Crossing the sandbar to Gugh at low tide — check tide tables at the quay first

 Getting around:  **Rideshare** ❌ not available

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Island Circuit Walk** — A 4-mile coastal loop takes in clifftop heathland, hidden coves, the pebble Troytown Maze, the old lighthouse, and...
- Gugh Island & The Old Man of Gugh** — At low tide a natural sandbar connects St Agnes to tiny Gugh, where you'll find a Bronze Age standing stone, ancient...
- Seabird & Wildlife Watching** — Between May and July, puffins nest on rocky islets just offshore.
- Beady Pool Beachcombing** — A 17th-century Dutch trading ship wrecked offshore here, and its cargo of Venetian-made glass and ceramic beads still...
- Troytown Farm Ice Cream** — The only dairy farm in the Isles of Scilly makes its own ice cream on-site from Jersey cows.

BEST WALKS

- Island Coastal Loop** 4 miles | ~2 hrs | Easy-moderate | All terrain — Start at Porth Conger Quay, walk south past the Turk's Head and up through the village to the old lighthouse, continue west to...
- Quay to Gugh via The Bar** 1 mile each way | 30–45 min each way | Easy | Check tides! — From the quay, walk five minutes along the harbour-side path to The Bar — the natural sandbar that connects St Agnes to the tidal...

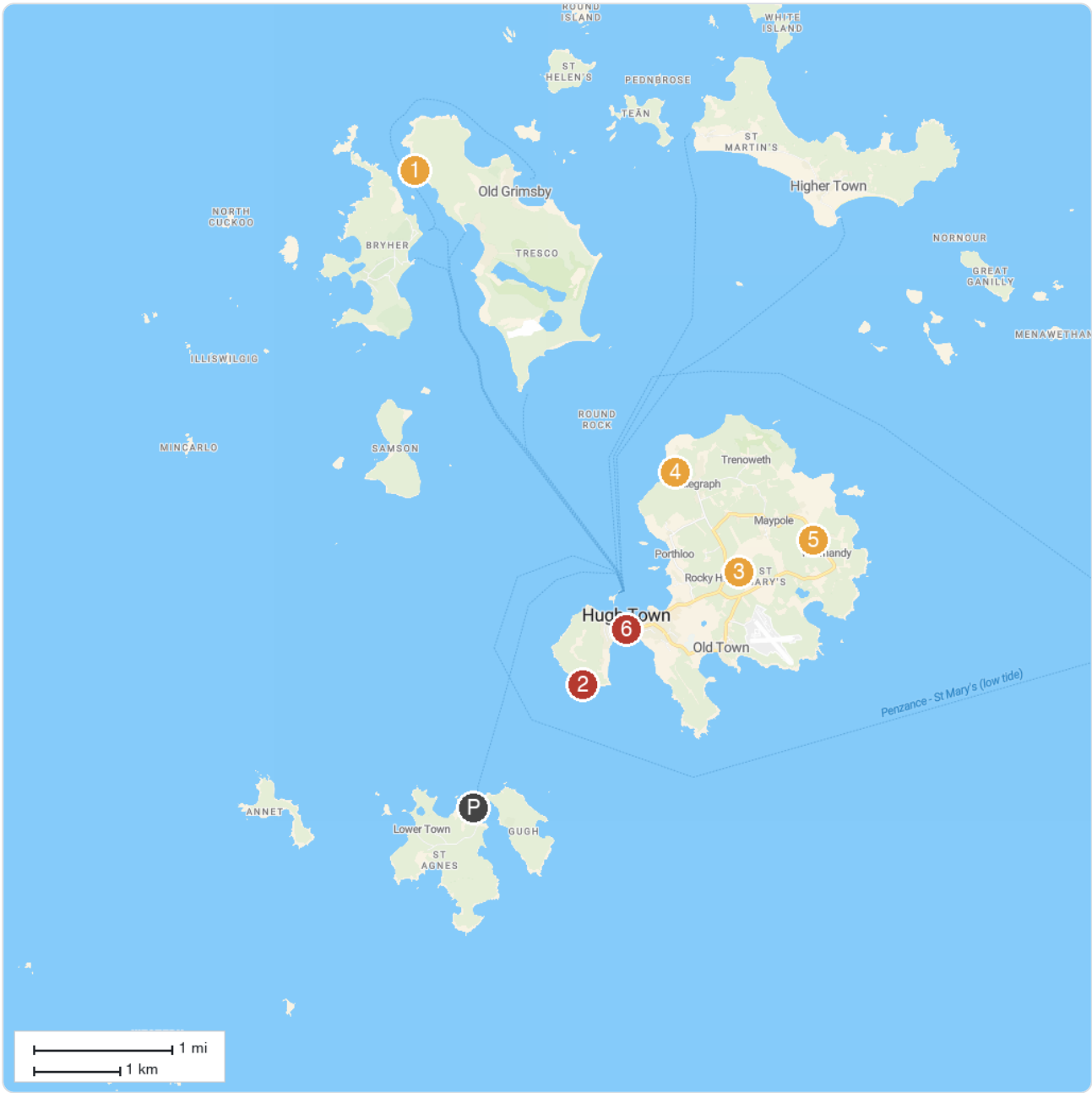
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
