GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Pier — Nabrzeże Pasażerskie below Chrobry Embankment (small/medium ships). Large ocean liners may dock at Świnoujście, 1.5 hrs away.

Best For: History, architecture, free self-guided walking, local street food

Walk to centre: 1–2 min to Chrobry Embankment; 10–12 min to Dukes' Castle; 12–15 min to Old Town

Don't Miss: Pasztecik Szczeciński at the original 1969 bar on Wojska Polskiego

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Pomeranian Dukes' Castle** — The Renaissance castle of the Dukes of Pomerania dominates the Old Town skyline.
- WWII Underground Trails** — Poland's largest civilian bomb shelter, built by Germans during WWII and repurposed as a Cold War nuclear shelter, sits...
- Szczecin Philharmonic — Iceberg Building** — The award-winning Szczecin Philharmonic won the Mies van der Rohe Prize for its extraordinary white angular facade that...
- St James Cathedral Observation Deck** — The 110-metre spire of Szczecin's Gothic brick cathedral offers the highest viewpoint in the city.
- Wyspa Grodzka City Beach** — A sandy river beach on the island directly opposite the cruise quay, reached by footbridge from the Old Town.

BEST WALKS

- Red Route: Embankment to Dukes' Castle & Old Town** 2.5 km · 45–60 min · flat to gentle uphill — Follow the red-dashed line painted on the pavement from Wały Chrobrego up to the Pomeranian Dukes' Castle, through the rebuilt Stare...
- Boulevard to the Parisian Star Plazas** 2 km · 25 min · flat — Walk north along Aleja Wojska Polskiego past grand Prussian-era apartment blocks — pick up a pasztecik at No.

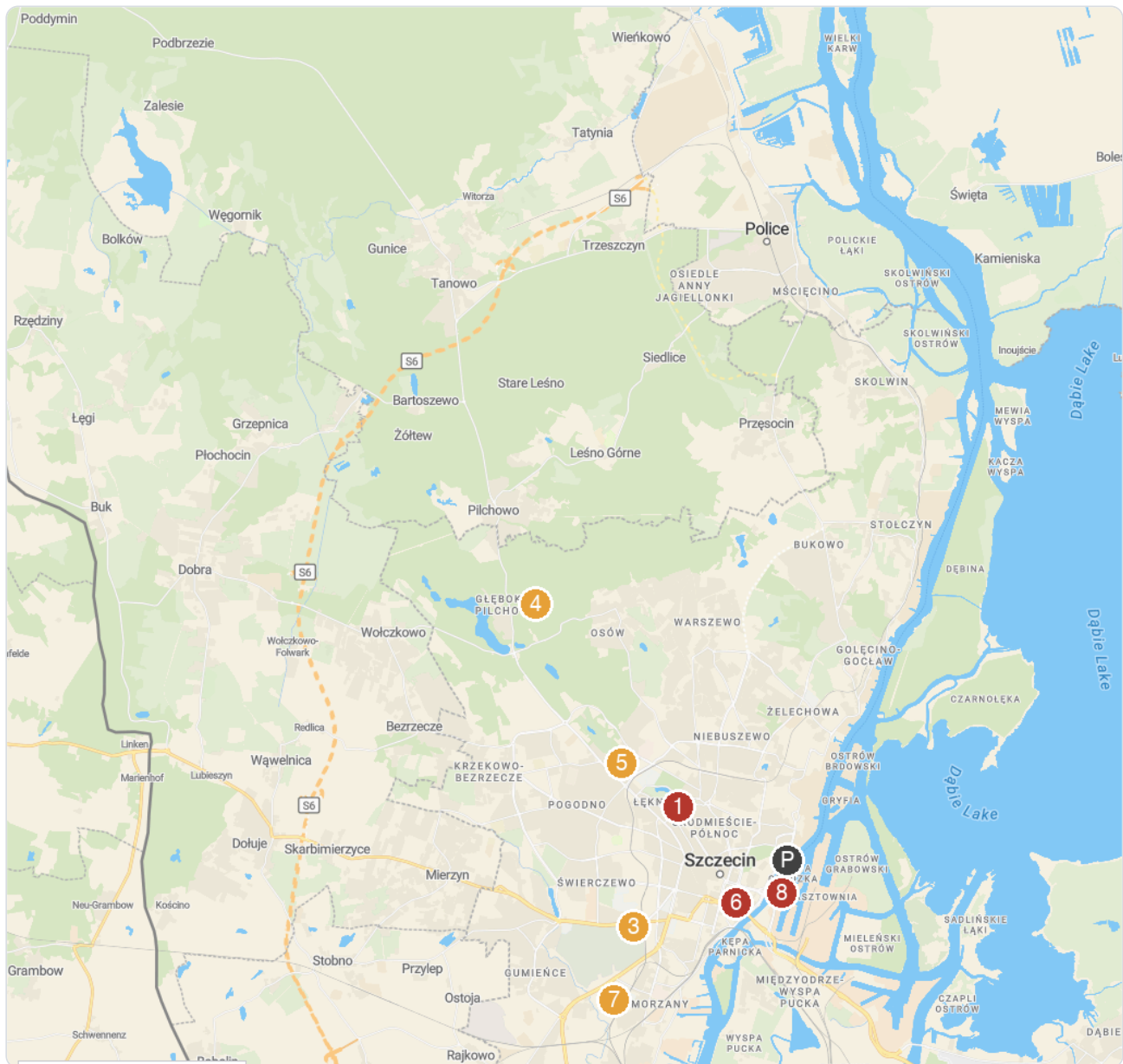
